



Arizona Exports to Mexico



AZ **EXPORTS** TO MEXICO **\$2.1 billion** in 2022 Q1, **down 0.04**% from 2021 Q1

Arizona exports to Mexico increased year-over-year in all 4 quarters of 2021, but marginally decreased in the 1st quarter of 2022.


Commodities flowing via Arizona BPOE were more than the same quarter 2019, signaling recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic.



U.S. fresh produce imports from Mexico via Arizona BPOE experience large seasonal fluctuations. These imports decreased yearover-year in the 1st quarter of both 2021 and 2022.

in 2022 Q1 up 56.2% from 2021 Q1

Persons crossing the Arizona-Mexico border reached a significant low in April 2020, due to travel restrictions related to the COVID-19 pandemic. This is the 4th consecutive guarter with double-digit year-over-year increases.


Vehicles Crossing Arizona Border (Northbound)

2.4 million VEHICLES **CROSSING** AZ **BORDER** NORTHBOUND

> in 2022 Q1 up **41.0**% from 2021 Q1

Personal vehicle and bus border crossings continue to recover from the COVID-19 pandemic, with Q1 2022 vehicle crossings exceeding Q1 2019. Commercial truck traffic decreased year-over-year (-4.6%) for the second consecutive quarter.
