


Arizona Exports to Mexico

Arizona exports to Mexico increased year-over-year for three consecutive quarters.



Fresh Produce Imports via Arizona BPOE


FRESH PRODUCE VIA AZ BPOE \$325 million total produce imports in 2021 Q3 up 8.9% from 2020 Q3

U.S. fresh produce imports from Mexico via Arizona BPOE experience large seasonal fluctuations. July, August, and September 2021 had the largest monthly volume of fresh produce imports ever (for each month), while third quarter 2021 was the highest third quarter ever.

Persons crossing the Arizona-Mexico border reached a significant low in April 2020, due to travel restrictions related to the COVID-19 pandemic. Border crossings continue to trend up, although still down from pre-COVID levels.


Vehicles Crossing Arizona Border (Northbound)

Personal vehicle and bus border crossings continue to recover from the COVID-19 pandemic. Commercial truck traffic remains resilient and was up 5.0% over the year.
